BIOGRAPHY

Ms. Shuping is the Chief of the Chemical, Biological, Radiological, and Nuclear Defense (CBRND) Test and Evaluation (T&E) Division in the Office of the CBRND T&E Executive. Her Division provides CBRN T&E oversight, to include strategy, policy, education and T&E documentation approval, to ensure adequate and credible T&E to inform decision makers.

Ms. Shuping leads a Joint DOD process for the establishment of CBRN T&E standards through the joint T&E Capabilities and Methodologies Integrated Process Team (TECMIPT). She led the development of this process, which has expanded in the last two years to include collaboration with thirteen interagency partners and the publication of the first federal interagency CBRN T&E standards to be collaboratively developed, approved and published. The TECMIPT process now provides direct support to the White House National Science and Technology Council Subcommittee on Standards for CBRNE.

Ms. Shuping leads a CBDP Enterprise analysis and decision process for efficient planning, development and sustainment of CBDP T&E infrastructure. She co-chairs the Joint Threat Coordination Working Group with the CBRND Joint Requirements Office, leading initiatives to improve Enterprise threat processes and risk assessments to inform T&E planning. She leads the Enterprise in all CBDP T&E federal interagency and international coordination and collaborative efforts.

Ms. Shuping has fourteen years' experience in DoD CBDP T&E. She was a CBDP Program Manager for Battelle prior to joining the DUSA-TE team at the Pentagon in 2007. Prior to that time, she was a Senior Analyst for the Navy's Operational Test and Evaluation Force in Norfolk, VA, the quality assurance manager at the Hoechst/Celanese chemical plant in Portsmouth, VA, and a high school and college chemistry teacher.
